It turns out that Mary Katharine was confirmed at First in 1939 and soon after moved to Texas. She was a longtime member Four Mile Lutheran in Mabank, Texas, but she never forgot First Lutheran as a place where her faith was formed and nurtured.

Her memorial gift is another good example of life long stewardship and a commitment to be a blessing to others. October is Clergy Appreciation Month!

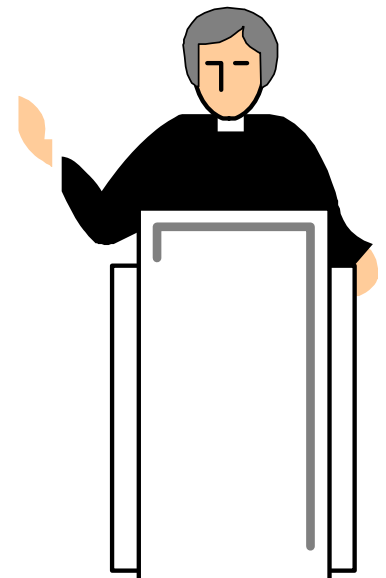

From Our Parish Nurse...

Dear Family and Friends,

Today I want to visit with you about Men's Health Issues: Prostate Health. In September we observe Prostate Cancer awareness week. We are encouraged to attend to our Faith and body because, "... listen closely to my words. Keep them in your heart: for they are life to those who find them and health to a man's whole body" (Pr. 4:20-22)

What Can I Do to Protect Myself From Prostate Cancer?

There are several things we can do to care for our health. First, we can eat a diet with a high percentage of plant based foods, including, fruits, veggies, legumes and whole grains, limited intake of meat and other animal products and balancing calorie intake with physical activity. Diets high in calories, fat and animal products were most strongly associated with deaths from prostate cancer, on the other, diets rich in grains and cereals, soybeans, nuts and fish appeared to offer some protection against this killer (especially soybeans). Second, all men over 40 years of age should have a physician examine of their prostate each year, after age 50, many doctors recommend also having PSA (Prostate Specific Antigen) blood test each year. See your doctor if you experience changes in urination or any unusual discomfort.

Third, Selenium may protect against advanced prostate cancer. Good sources of selenium include whole grains and other seeds. To learn more visit www.uro.com/prostate.htm or www.menshealthnetwork.org if you need more info please contact me.

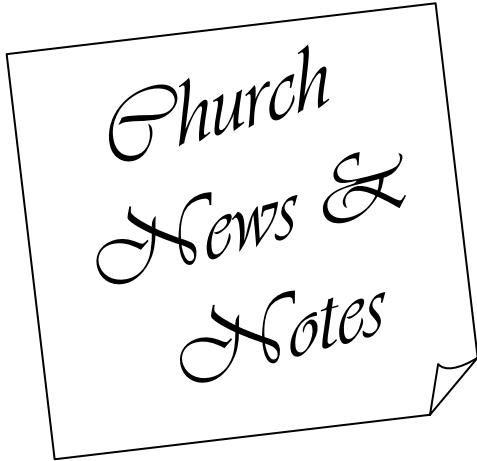

From Bishop Hansen.

As God's people, we stand up for justice and mercy

In 1 Peter 4, we learn that we are not just any people, we are God's people. During these days of political advertisements and primaries, I spent some time thinking about what this means for us as fellow citizens. I believe it means that we stand up and speak up for certain things and that we exercise our voting rights accordingly. All the bantering about what it means to be a Republican or a Democrat can become an elephant (or donkey) in the room that prevents us from standing up and speaking up as disciples of Christ. As Christians, we stand up for God's creation. We care about the environment and engage in caretaking so that God's creation will be preserved for future generations. We stand up for people on the edges, people without, people treated unjustly, people in need of access, people who need a lift, and people without health and wholeness. We show mercy, stand for peace, and pray for our enemies. We do these things with the knowledge that God loves the whole world and will go to any length so that all may know his reconciling love in Jesus Christ. And we know that on this broken side of creation, God is creating all things new and is using us to make a difference. Our sermons, our teaching and our praying must take seriously God's hope in us.

New Charitable Giving Law Affects Many Seniors! Pass It On!

On August 17, 2006, President Bush signed the Pension Protection Act that makes charitable giving from IRA's possible for the first time by "rolling over" an IRA distribution directly to a charitable institution.

WHAT'S NEW? At age 70-1/2, seniors must take minimum distributions from IRA's that become taxable income. For the first time it is possible for seniors to "roll over" an IRA distribution directly to a charity and not have to claim it as income and be taxed. There is no charitable deduction given, only the freedom from taking the rollover as income.

WHY IS THAT IMPORTANT? Such a gift can fulfill the requirement for a minimum distribution without incurring taxes or pushing an individual into a higher tax bracket for Social Security taxation. Donors who do not itemize but take a standard deduction on their taxes avoid additional income while making a gift that they otherwise could not take a charitable deduction for. This rollover is also an easy way to make a charitable gift.

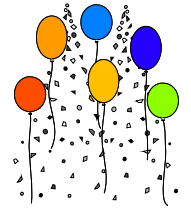
WHAT ELSE IS NEW? Generous donors could give up to \$100,000 in this manner from a regular Roth or Roth IRA without taxation even if they exceeded the normal maximum permissible level of taxable giving for the year.

AND? A 401k could be used as well by rolling it over into an IRA, a simple process, and then transferring it to a charity with all the same benefits to the charity and the donor.

WHEN? This new law is in effect only in 2006 and 2007 as a result of long awaited charitable legislation reform.
